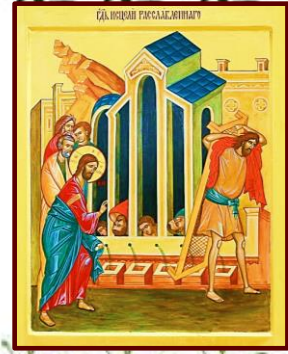

From Your Pastor

A story is told about a parish whose organist retired, so a search began for a replacement. Each Sunday the pastor listed a number of songs for potential candidates to play during the service and he also allowed them to pick a song of their own choosing to play immediately following his message.

One Sunday, the pastor began speaking on the serious lack of funds in the parish treasury to do the much-needed repairs to the building. He explained that income for the hall rental was greatly decreased because young people were not getting married as they did 25 years ago. While pyrohy used to be sold by only a few churches, they were now being sold in neighborhood businesses as well as in supermarkets.

He continued by asking parishioners to contribute generously to the reseeding of the church lawn, as well as the \$6,500.00 needed to cut the grass during the summer. He, himself, even donated \$200.00 to this parish cause and he asked the parishioners to follow his example and to stand up if they would also donate \$100.00.

As he finished speaking, the candidate for organist who was playing that day immediately began playing "The Star-Spangled Banner". Everyone stood up. She got the job and the church got the needed funds!

In a few weeks (Sunday, May 28th), we will celebrate the 50th anniversary of the consecration of our church. There are many repairs that need to be done. Please be as generous as our parents and grandparents were when the church building was being constructed.
