

Printed below is the schedule for visitation of parishioners' homes by the parish clergy with Holy Water. If you are not going to be home on the scheduled date, please phone the rectory. Also, if, because of bad weather, there is a necessity to cancel that date, a new date will be announced later and the clergy will continue blessing as scheduled.

Please remember that the blessing of one's home is a religious service. Please rise and turn off the radio and/or television. It is also appropriate to have a lit candle on a table and to participate in the services by your presence in the room.
