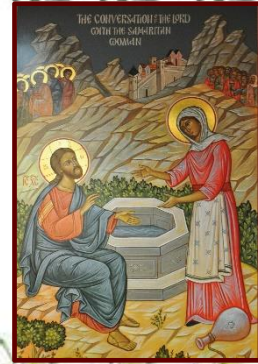

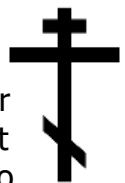
Please note that, because of the joy of the Paschal Season, there is NO kneeling in church from Pascha until Pentecost Sunday, June 20th.

Dear Parishioners,

I'm sending this message to explain what will be changing regarding church services after June 2, 2021. As everyone is aware Governor DeWine is lifting COVID-19 restrictions on that date. So, what does that mean for attending church services?

These are the changes:

1. Reservations and contact information will not be taken anymore.
2. Temperatures will not be taken.
3. Choir will move back upstairs.
4. Masks will be optional, but we ask if you are not vaccinated to please wear a mask.
5. Holy Confession for those who are vaccinated will be celebrated in the usual way before the Liturgy. For those who are not vaccinated, it will be during the week by appointment.
6. Live streaming of the church services will be only on the major feast days of the Church.

What will not change:

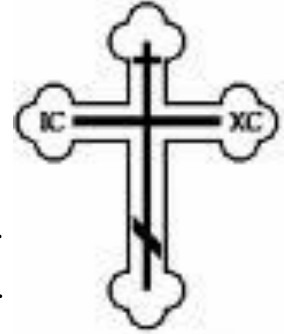
1. We will continue to social distance; pews will be roped off.
2. We will continue to sanitize the pews between the English and Ukrainian Liturgies.
