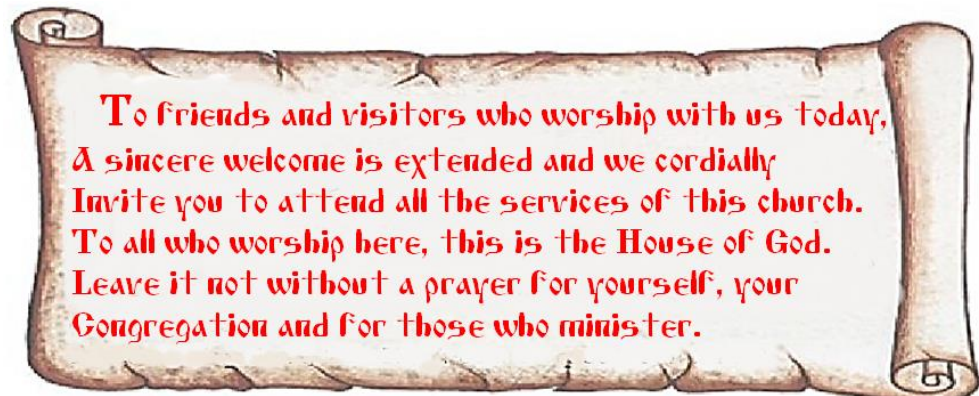

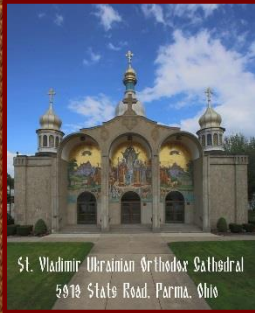

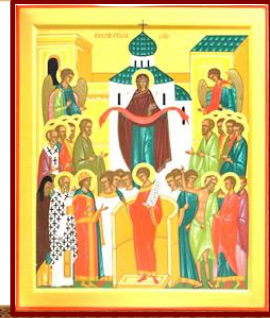

The Protection of the Mother of God

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, on October 14 our Holy Orthodox Church celebrates feast day of the Protection of the Mother of God. This miraculous appearance of the Mother of God occurred during the 10th century at the Blachernae church in Constantinople (modern-day Istanbul) where several of her relics were kept. On Sunday, October 14 at four in the morning, St. Andrew the Blessed Fool-for-Christ, who was a Slav by birth, saw the dome of the church open and the Virgin Mary enter, moving in the air above him, glowing and surrounded by angels and saints. She knelt and prayed with tears for all faithful Christians in the world. The Virgin Mary asked Her Son, Jesus Christ, to accept the prayers of all the people entreating Him and looking for Her protection. Once Her prayer was completed, She walked to the altar and continued to pray. Afterwards, She spread Her veil over all the people in the church as a protection. St Andrew turned to his disciple, St. Epiphanius, who was standing near him, and asked, "Do you see, brother, the Holy Theotokos, praying for all the world?" Epiphanius answered, "Yes, Holy Father, I see it and am amazed!"
